The Score – The Return on Your Investment:

The Center for Neighborhood Enterprise believes that organizations should be judged – and supported – on the basis of measurable outcomes. Here are some of CNE's 2009 results:

- Baylor University released its case study of the Violence-Free Zone in Milwaukee reporting a 32% reduction in violent incidents in three large high schools, reductions in suspensions from 37% to 44%, and increase in GPI of 4% in six schools.
- TMilwaukee District Attorney said city crime is at lowest level in 25 years, and cited VFZ program as a "key" factor.
- TRichmond, VA Police Department reported 61% reduction in motor vehicle thefts around George Wythe High School and credits VFZ. Police calls to the school down 99%.
- TCNE provided technical assistance to 20 community-organizations in Washington, DC's most disadvantaged wards so they can better serve those in need.
- TA total of 6,197 low and middle-income adults received financial literacy training in 150 workshops during 2009. CNE and HSBC-North American have provided financial literacy education to 22,484 low and middle-income adults from 2006-2009.

As you make your year-end giving decisions, please look at our results and compare them with other organizations. Ask whether significant reductions in crime and violence, the strengthening of community-based service providers, and training to help low and middle income individuals and families make good financial decisions are investments worthy of your support.
